CONNECTED: Updated technology to support 21st-century teaching and learning.




FUTURE-READY: Ensure our schools are modern, functional, and provide high-quality programming to prepare students for their futures.

WHAT IS THE PLAN?

If approved, this levy will provide funding for:

1. Safety + Security Improvements

Secure building entrances, visitor check-in systems, security cameras, lockdown tools to ensure student and staff safety, and cybersecurity improvements to protect sensitive student data.

2. Technology Infrastructure

Reliable funding for replacing outdated devices and upgrading network infrastructure, and reduced classroom time spent troubleshooting technology issues.

3. Facility Updates

Critical facility updates to career-tech spaces, parking lots, HVAC systems, playgrounds, and outdoor athletic facilities at the middle and high school.

What Happens if the Referendum **Does Not Pass?**

Since the 2020-2021 school year, Alexandria Public Schools has faced **significant budget challenges**, cutting over **\$5 million** and using reserve funds to balance the budget.

WITHOUT ADDITIONAL FUNDING, THE DISTRICT RISKS:

- **Continued Funding Challenges:** The district will have to make more cuts, possibly resulting in larger class sizes, fewer electives, and reduced services and resources for students.
- **Delayed or Deferred Maintenance:** Safety upgrades, technology equipment and facility improvements would be postponed.





WHAT WILL BE ON THE BALLOT?

Voters will be asked whether to authorize a capital project levy for \$3 million annually for 10 years. If approved, capital projects funding would provide a stable and secure funding source that allows the district to invest in safety, technology, and up-to-date facilities.
